Heralding at Pennsic

Although Atlantia is not one of the "big 3" Pennsic kingdoms (the Midrealm, the East, and Aethelmearc), Atlantians have always gone to Pennsic. Many of us look forward to it as a time when we can leave a lot of the trappings of our day-to-day lives and "come home".

Please consider giving your once-a-year neighbors a little of your time and come to Heralds' Point at Pennsic. Heralds' Point will open for business on the tenth (Land Grab Wednesday) and close on the nineteenth (Friday of War Week). Except for the tenth, eleventh, thirteenth, and seventeenth, Heralds' Point will be open from eleven to five. On those days, Heralds' Point's operating hours will be confined to the afternoon.

If book heraldry is more your style, come sit at the consulting tables. Also, if you didn't have a chance to go to any of the meetings of the Wreath Queen of Arms while she was in northern Atlantia, the Sovereigns of Arms customarily hold a joint meeting at Pennsic. Also, there will be classes at Heralds' Point every morning, before Heralds' Point will open for business that day.
