nto the dedicated members of the Atlantian College of Heralds, greetings from Triton on this very chilly eve!

One has to wonder, just what is the purpose of a newsletter solely for our College? After all, I have a page in the *Acorn* to extol on all things heraldic. In addition to that, we have the Atlantian Herald's List giving me daily, near constant communication with the majority of our members. Throw in the telephone, individual e-mails, texting, Twitter, Facebook... It's an embarrassment of riches when it comes to communicating in today's world. So, what's the point behind the *Herald's Point*?

I'm glad you asked! There are many reasons why I'd like a private, more personal, yet permanent communiqué with the members of our College.

E-mail has become so ubiquitous in our culture, that it's become a bit unreliable when it becomes the sole method of conveying information, especially important policy notifications. Admit it. Also, I may make broad announcements here that we can then fine tune on the Herald's List. These two tools will work very much in tandem.

As you may have noticed, I have returned to the old policy of posting Laurel Acceptances and Returns in the *Acorn*. I feel that it is an important use of space, as it provides greater transparency to what we do as heralds and how, ultimately, the submissions process works on behalf of our clientele. However, those letters will also continue to be published here as well as online. Each reaches a potentially different audience and I'd rather have overlap than gaps when it comes to sharing information. Do make it a point to read my monthly letters in the *Acorn* but also know that they are primarily geared for the non-heraldic populace. Members of the College of Heralds will find the bulk of my news and notifications of heraldic matters right here in these pages.

I will be the first to confess, I often did not read *Herald's Point* when it came out. I'd see the notice posted on the Herald's List or the Merry Rose that a new issue had been published. I'd think to myself, "Oooh, I really need to go read that." Then I'd get distracted by something shiny or a blinking light and forget all about it. But that never stopped me from checking off the 'Y' in my quarterly reports where it asked if I'm reading *Herald's Point*. After all, I *meant* to read it. Surely, that counts.

Except that it doesn't.

That's what I'll be doing from now on. And, in doing that, and by reading the contents of this newsletter, I will become a better herald. And so will you, if you join me.

TRITON (Principal Herald) – Triton is the head of the Kingdom's College of Heralds and is responsible for supervising field heraldry and court heraldry at events within the Kingdom. Triton is also responsible for supervising College of Arms activities within the Kingdom, including the timely processing of submissions for names and armory. This position is currently held by Master Bran Trefonnen.

NEREID (Emergency Deputy) – Nereid stands ready to assume the functions of the Principal Herald in emergency situations. Triton works very closely with Nereid to insure the smooth transition of office, should something unfortunate occur. This position is currently held by Herrin Gisela vom Kreuzbach.

SEA STAG (Education) – This department head oversees the creation and implementation of heraldic education for both heralds within the CoH and also the populace at large.

SEA TYGER (Names) – Recruits and fosters teachers for University as well as Collegiums, Symposia, and whatever educational opportunities present themselves where onomastics can be taught and promoted.

SEA DRAGON (Armory) – Recruits and fosters teachers for University as well as Collegiums, Symposia, and whatever educational opportunities present themselves where armory can be taught and promoted.

CONCH (Vocal) – Recruits and fosters teachers for University as well as Collegiums, Symposia, and whatever educational opportunities present themselves where vocal training can be taught and promoted. This position is currently held by Master Donal Mac Ruiseart.

HIPPOCAMPUS (Court) – Recruits and fosters teachers for University as well as Collegiums, Symposia, and whatever educational opportunities present themselves where court skills can be taught and promoted. This position is currently held Baron Talorgen Hersir nepos Wrguist.

MANATEE (Commentary) – Recruits and fosters teachers for University as well as Collegiums, Symposia, online e-mail lists, and whatever educational opportunities present themselves where heralds can be helped to improve their skills in providing commentary to the CoH and the CoA.

GOLDEN DOLPHIN (Submissions) – Golden Dolphin is responsible for processing all submissions received from residents of the Kingdom of Atlantia, including submissions received at authorized consultation tables held outside the boundaries of the Kingdom (e.g., at *Pennsic*). This position is currently held by Mistress Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane.

OPAL (Names) – Opal assists Golden Dolphin in the research and commentary necessary for name submissions. They are expected to comment regularly on internal Lols.

VEXILLUM (Armory) – Vexillum assists Golden Dolphin in the research and commentary necessary for armory submissions. They are expected to comment regularly on internal Lols.

IBIS (Commentary) – Ibis assists Golden Dolphin and works with Manatee in the recruitment, motivation, and retention of commenting heralds necessary for all submissions. They are expected to comment regularly on internal Lols.

BLUE SHARK (Consultation – MD/DC) – This Consul is responsible for arranging authorized consultation tables to provide submissions assistance and receive submissions at appropriate Kingdom and regional events in the MD/DC area. This position is currently held by Lady Alexandria Wright.

RED SHARK (Consultation – VA) – This Consul is responsible for arranging authorized consultation tables to provide submissions assistance and receive submissions at appropriate Kingdom and regional events in the VA area.

GREEN SHARK (Consultation – NC) – This Consul is responsible for arranging authorized consultation tables to provide submissions assistance and receive submissions at appropriate Kingdom and regional events in the NC area.

SILVER SHARK (Consultation – SC/GA) – This Consul is responsible for arranging authorized consultation tables to provide submissions assistance and receive submissions at appropriate Kingdom and regional events in the SC/GA area.

PEARL (Ceremony) – This department head oversees the creation and implementation of ceremonies used throughout the Kingdom. This position is currently held by Mistress Rhiannon ui Neill.

ALCYON (Processionals) – The deputy organizes marches of precedence for events, especially Crown Tournaments. This position is currently held by Master Peter Hawkyns.

SILVER NAUTILUS (Court) – This deputy works with Triton and Pearl to organize Court assignments for events. They guide assigned heralds on how to best serve the needs of the attending Royalty, encourage the use of seconds, and follow up on Court reports, along with Kraken.

SEA URCHIN (Protocol) – Fosters and promotes the proper execution of court and heraldic protocols amongst the CoH and the populace with whatever educational opportunities present themselves.

ALBATROSS (Voice) – This department head oversees the organization and proper execution of event and field announcements at events within the Kingdom. This position is currently held by Baron Michael Batcock.

YEW BOW (Announcements) – This deputy coordinates with Albatross and event autocrats to insure adequate voice heralds for the smooth running of the event.

QUINTAIN (Tournaments) – This deputy coordinates with Albatross, event autocrats, and marshals-in-charge to insure adequate and appropriate field heralds for the smooth running of the tournament(s).

KRAKEN (Reporting) – Kraken maintains reporting oversight for every member of the CoH, including Triton, with reminders prior to deadlines and follow-up once they have passed.

SHARK'S TOOTH (Quarterly Compliance) – Shark's Tooth monitors the quarterly reporting of every warranted herald in the CoH and collates that data for Triton's use, including membership expirations and continuing education. This position is currently held by Master Fritz Justus Fritz.

CORAL BRANCH (CoH Exchequer) – The Coral Branch Pursuivant oversees the checking account for the college, including money collected for submissions or from any other source. They are responsible for reporting to the Kingdom Exchequer and for any financial matters pertaining to the CoH. This position is currently held by Mistress Ealdthryth of Humberstone.

NARWHAL (Oversight) – This is a Senior Adviser position to Triton which is currently held by Lord Kwellend-Njal Kolskeggsson.

UNDINE (Clerk of the Signet) – The Undine Pursuivant, or Clerk of the Signet, or Clerk Signet, supervises the production of award scrolls as required by the Crown. They also help promote the development of calligraphy and illumination in the Kingdom. This position is currently held by Mistress Sunniva Kyrre and will soon be taken on by Baroness Tegan de Moreton.

FINSTERWALD (Clerk of Precedence) – The Finsterwald Pursuivant maintains the records of all awards bestowed upon the residents of Atlantia. This position is currently held by Lady Glynnis Gwynedd.

BRIGHT LEAF (OP Webminister) – This Webminister works with the Kingdom Webminister and oversees the Order of Precedence online and maintains the functionality of this resource. This position is currently held by Lady Cassandra Arabella Giordani.

MANTICORE (Herald's Point Editor) – The Manticore Pursuivant works under the auspices of both Triton and the Kingdom Chronicler's office to produce the CoH newsletter: *Herald's Point*. This position is currently held by Lady Patricia of Trakai.

HERRING (Heralds Website) – This Webminister works with the Kingdom Webminister and oversees the Kingdom Herald's Office online presence. This position is currently held by Lord Cyriac Grymsdale.

GORDIAN KNOT (Baronial Pursuivant) – The Gordian Knot Pursuivant is the baronial herald for Nottinghill Coill. This position is currently held by Baron Lucien de La Rochelle.

Now that you've looked this over: DON'T FREAK OUT! Perhaps it's the performing spirit that inhabits many heralds, or the dramatic nature of many of us in the SCA, but we do so love to panic. This is especially true

when faced with change. What you're seeing here is my *ideal* organization for the College of Heralds and what I'll be working towards with your support and guidance. Just because I've written it down, doesn't set it in stone. It's set it in *very* editable, *very* re-printable paper. Only trees need be harmed as we navigate this reorganization – no people. :-)

Minutes of Heralds' Meeting, Unevent 2009

Mistress Rhiannon noted that it was her last Unevent as Triton Herald, and thus she wanted to say "thank you" to many people: Mistress Alisoun, Golden Dolphin; Mistress Sunniva, Clerk Signet; Maestra Cassandra, who was Clerk of Precedence and went on to become Kingdom Webminister; Lady Glynis, current Clerk of Precedence; Lady Patricia, editor of Herald's Point; all those who contributed to Herald's Point during her term; Fritz, the "paperwork thug"; and Baroness Rhonwen for designing the heraldic flash cards (a second set is coming out).




Congratulations to Baroness Rhonwen verch Tuder on winning the Pennsic Heraldic Photo Contest with this image of Queen Judith of Drachenwald at Opening Ceremonies! Then, with a "Poof!" to each person, Mistress Rhiannon promoted several people to the rank of Pursuivant in the College: Patricia, Kevin (the CoH webminister), Niccolina, Cian and Rosanella. Next, she elevated Lucien to the rank of Gordian Knot Herald and Talorgen to the rank of Herald.

Master Bran then stepped up to lead the rest of the meeting. He said he is very focused on the College and on heraldic education, so that we all learn and progress as heralds. He said he didn't like the idea of regional deputies, because baronial heralds are the regional heralds, so he asked for the baronial heralds to contact him directly. He discussed the purpose of titles and discussed the position and duties of Golden Dolphin. Gise will be Nereid Herald as of Twelfth Night. He talked about making up cards for warranted heralds (who will have to be SCA members) and a possible monthly "hat grab" for heralds. He also discussed capital-H Heralds working with Cornets to improve the heraldic education. Finally, we went around the room and introduced ourselves to each other. Mistress Alisoun reminded us that if we don't register our own names and devices with the College of Arms, we lose a lot of credibility. She said that it is preferable for submitters to pay the fee with their own check or money order, but the local herald can also run it through the baronial account, though the exchequer has to show it as a transfer. Checks need to be made out to SCA Inc., College of Heralds of Atlantia.

College of Heralds Atlantian Ensign Tabard - 1

This is the style of tabard I created for my investiture as Triton. It's based on the Atlantian ensign and the symbol Mistress Rhiannon had me create while she was Triton. It makes a super-spiffy tabard and screams both Atlantia *and* herald! Obviously, I'm biased (but I liked it so much I made a half dozen so we'd have matching heralds for Crown Tournament). If you're looking to make some new heraldic regalia, especially if you are an At-Large herald, this may be just the design you're looking for. It's based on a late 14th c. design.



I have made templates of all the shapes employed on this pattern -- the sleeve shapes and trumpets, the front trumpets, the wave shape, and even a guide to placing the trumpets on the wave. Just drop me a note and I will make a set to send to you. I can also include fabric swatches if you'd like to try and match colors.

I order most of my fabrics online (the blue, white, and gold) from http://www.onlinefabricstore.net/ Look under "Craft Fabric" then "Trigger Fabric."

It's a 65%/35% poly/cotton blend that is quite durable and colorfast. I believe it's also on sale this month for \$3.50 a yard (although the prices are always pretty good)!

I used the ROYAL trigger, the GOLD, trigger (not the Yellow), the WHITE trigger, and the GREEN (forest, not kelly) trigger. Hancock Fabrics also carries this fabric in similar colors. I lined it with a similarly colored, but thinner blue poly/cotton broadcloth.

I use Wonder Under for ALL of my appliqué work (that tacks it in place securely while you run your tight, zigzag stitch). I also used a matching (Yale Blue) quilt binding to close up the neck.

No one is required to make one of these! I just thought you'd like to know how I made mine so that, if you wanted, you could match. Nothing looks better in a processional or on the tourney field than matching heralds! So, if you were looking for a new heraldic project...:-)







This is one of two I managed to do without the quilt binding for the neck hole before I just gave up. It is soooo much easier to finish off the neck with the quilt binding. The back is blank but could just as easily have been a match of the front. Of course, if you duplicate the front, you also have the makings of a second tabard! So, that's the route I took.

I've included various *finished* measurements on the pattern diagram. Obviously, you can adjust them to suit your individual needs. I just thought it might help to have some idea of how I scaled mine.

Anyway, I hope this inspires at least some of you to dust off that sewing machine. It's the first thing I've sewn in about ten years! But a zigzag stitch is pretty easy to manage, it's just tedious. Each of the big trumpets took almost a whole bobbin, so wind a few before you start.

Please, don't hesitate to contact me if there's any other information I provide that may help you. --BRAN

Laurel Letter of Acceptances and Returns, September 2009

Unto the populace of Atlantia, greetings from Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane, Golden Dolphin Herald!

The Laurel Office has notified us of the results of its considerations at the meetings in September, 2009. The results for this meeting were contained in a letter from the Laurel Office received in Atlantia on 28 November, 2009.

ACCEPTANCES:

The following items were **REGISTERED** by the Laurel Office:

Abigail Lilian d'Arcy. Name.

Æsa Gunnarsdóttir. Name and device. Sable, a pegasus segreant and on a chief wavy argent a roundel between an increscent and a decrescent azure.

Angus of Bedford. Device. Checky argent and gules, two boars rampant addorsed sable and on a chief embattled Or three battle axes bendwise sinister reversed gules.

Aveline Marie d'Avignon. Name.

Azalais de Dia. Name and device. Azure, a foi within an orle argent.

Bellavene Scolari. Name.

Bj{0,}rn inn hávi. Badge. Sable, on a pale endorsed Or three pellets.

Cerball na hInnsi mac Donndubáin. Name.

Ceridwen ferch Owain. Alternate persona name for Ceridwen South. The given name is grandfathered to the submitter.

Chikkaya Valandi. Name. The Laurel staff changed the spelling of the submitted name Chikayya Valandi to Chikkaya Valandi to match the spelling in the online article used for documentation.

Christoph Krieger. Device. Azure, a panther rampant Or spotted sable incensed, collared and chained, within a bordure argent. The Laurel staff asked that the links in the chain be drawn larger and fewer in number to make them more identifiable against the azure field.

Cian mac Cellacháin hUí Dhublaich. Name. The Laurel staff modified the submitted Cian mac Ceallacháin Uí Dubhlaich to make the byname completely grammatical. The byname was modified according to the rules of middle Irish orthography because the submitter had requested that any changes retain the language and culture of Ireland from the tenth to the twelfth century.

Eilionora inghean Domhnaill. Name.

Eleonora Pragensis. Name.

Estienne Michel. Name. The Laurel staff modified the submitted name of Estienne Michel d'Avignon because they felt that this name appeared to be a claim to be the son of Michel d'Avignon whose name was registered some years ago. They dropped the d'Avignon in order to remove the appearance of presumption rather than dropping the Michel because, if Michel had been omitted, the name would then conflict with the registered name of Estienne d'Avignon.

Felix del Rey. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Glaukos the Athenian. Change of device. Purpure, an owl contourny within a bordure embattled Or. As the submitter requested, his old device ("Purpure, a chevron inverted between a rose and a chalice argent.") has been retained as a badge.

Godai Katsunaga. Device. Sable, a pheon inverted within a mascle argent.

Grímkell Tannason. Name.

Guillaume d'Avignon. Name.

Henry Bartholomew Weste. Name (see RETURNS for device).

Hidden Mountain, Barony of. Order name for Order of the Azure Mountain. The order name has been associated with the previously registered badge of "Per chevron argent and azure, three clouds one and two azure." Note that the Barony had permission to conflict with the name of the Canton of Azurmont.

Hroði of Raven's Cove. Holding name and device. Gules, a double-bitted axe Or and in chief two ravens respectant argent. This device was submitted under the name of Hroði Hrólfsson which was previously returned by Laurel.

Hubert Pierre d'Avignon. Name.

Ivarr jafnkollr. Name.

John Thomas of York. Name and device. Per chevron inverted gules and argent, a pair of wings argent and an anchor sable.

Judeke von Colberg. Name.

Katarzyna Witkowska. Name and device. Per pale vert and argent, on a chevron two arrows with points to center, in chief a rose all counterchanged. The Laurel staff requested that the submitter "draw the chevron so that the point rises higher on the field."

Levi d'Avignon. Name.

Lillie of the Red Tower. Name (see RETURNS for device). Lillie is the submitter's legal given name.

Merecwen Albern. Change of name from Merewen Albern. The Laurel Office changed the byname in the submitted Merecwen Albeorn, accepting the arguments for the registerability of Merecwen as an Old English form, but feeling that the byname was insufficiently documented.

Ormr Gunnarsson. Name.

Reis Brangweyn. Device. Quarterly vert and sable, on a plate a triskele sable, a chief embattled argent.

Sabelina Portefleur. Name.

Sorcha MacParson. Name.

Tat'iana Aleksandrovna Ragozina. Change of device. Per pale gules and sable, a natural tiger rampant argent marked sable and on a chief argent a roundel between an increscent and a decrescent sable. Her old device ("Per pale azure and sable, a natural tiger rampant argent marked sable and on a chief argent a roundel between an increscent and decrescent sable.") was retained as a badge. The Laurel staff explicitly noted that the sable markings against the sable portion of the field would have been grounds for return had they not been "grandfathered" because already were in the previous device.

Temair ingen Fháelchon meic Domnaill. Name and device. Per chevron vert and azure, a wolf rampant and in canton a roundel argent.

Tristan Frogier d'Avignon. Name.

William atte Nunnes. Name and device. Azure, a tree eradicated and on a chief invected argent three crosses pommelly gules.

William Scolari. Name.

Ysabel Clarice. Name.

RETURNS:

The following items have been returned for the stated reasons:

Felix del Rey. Device. Per chevron azure and argent, three open books one and two Or and a sword inverted sable. The Laurel staff returned the device because they felt that the books did not meet current standards for depictions of books in Society heraldry, requiring that there be multiple pages visible at the sides of the open book with a distinct cover behind them. When resubmitting, they also asked that the sword be drawn in a more standard manner with a more prominent hilt on the sword.

Henry Bartholomew Weste. Device. Per pale azure and sable, on a tankard Or a Celtic cross azure. The Laurel staff returned the device for conflict with Gregory of Grand Sea ("Barry wavy argent and azure, on a pitcher

Or a compass star azure.") ruling that there was no difference allowable between a tankard and a pitcher and that the change in type alone of the compass star to a cross did not give difference because of the visual complexity of the tankard.

Lillie of the Red Tower. Name and device. Per bend vert and argent, a lily argent and three towers gules. The Laurel Office ruled this conflicted with Monique de la

Maison Rouge ("Quarterly argent and gules, four towers counterchanged."), with only one difference for the change in field since only one of four charges on the field has been changed in type or tincture and the change in position is required by the change in field division and tincture.

Laurel Letter of Acceptances and Returns, October 2009

Unto the populace of Atlantia, greetings from Alisoun MacCoul of Elphane, Golden Dolphin Herald!

The Laurel Office has notified us of the results of its considerations at the meetings in October, 2009. The results for these meetings were contained in a letter from the Laurel Office received in Atlantia on 30 November, 2009.

ACCEPTANCES:

The following items were REGISTERED by the Laurel Office:

Al Altan. Name and device. Or, three eagles gules.

Arnóra hrafn Óláfsdóttir. Change of device. Per bend gules and Or, a raven volant bendwise within a bordure sable. Her old device ("Lozengy gules and Or, a raven within a bordure sable.") is retained as a badge.

Caitilin Irruis inghean ui Riada. Name. The name appeared on the Atlantian Letter of Intent as Caitilín Irruis inghean uí Riada. The Laurel staff removed the markings which had been added in kingdom to match the submitter's documentation as the submitter had not requested authenticity in her name.

Calle Dore. Name and device. Azure, a bend doubly cotised argent.

Ceara ní Néill. Change of device. Azure, a sea-goat Or within a bordure embattled Or hurty.

Edward Tallis. Name.

Elizabeth Pynnoke. Name.

Giacinta of Highland Foorde. Name. The name was

submitted as Jacintha of Highland Foorde. To register the name the Laurel staff modified the submitted given name to a period Italian form since they felt that the mention of the marriage of a woman called by the name Jacintha in a footnote which mentioned her marriage in 1081 did not adequately document Jacintha as the period form by which the woman would have been known in period.

Godric Linch. Name.

Grímkell Tannason. Device. Argent, in pale pair of wings conjoined in lure sable and an oak tree eradicated gules.

Guntram Obermann. Name and device. Per pale dovetailed gules and argent, an arrow argent and a crow sable.

Gwenhevare of Alnwick. New name.

Jack Black of Flint. Device. Per bend sinister argent and sable, a club bendwise sinister and a skull counterchanged.

Martine Picot. Name and device. Or, on a chevron azure between three martens statant proper five annulets argent.

Martine Picot. Badge. Or, the letter "M" between five annulets, one, two and two, azure.

Melisant de Bretagne. Name and device. Per chevron gules and Or, two rapiers inverted in chevron Or and a peacock feather proper. The Laurel staff modified the submitted name Melisande de Bretagne, ruling that the existence of period forms like Milesenda and Melisant were not sufficient to allow registration of the given name Melisande. To register the name, they substituted

the most similar period spelling of the name.

Muirenn ingen uí Fhlannacáin. Name.

Niccolina the Wanderer. Badge. (Fieldless) In pale a rat rampant sable maintaining a mullet and standing atop a crescent pendant purpure.

Ormr Gunnarsson. Device. Sable, on a bezant a serpent glissant palewise vert, a bordure raguly Or.

Riacat of Ponte Alto. Name.

Sorcha Crowe. Device. Azure, a sun argent eclipsed azure within a bordure argent semy of crows azure.

Vilhjámr bani. Name. The Laurel staff modified the submitted byname spjótsbani, constructed on the pattern of berserkjabani ("berserk's bane") using the word for spear (spjót) because they felt that the examples provided for compounds with bani all involved either the

name or a description of a person for whom an individual was the bane (e.g., Hundings bani or bróðor bani) or were metaphorical (e.g., "bane of wood" used for fire) and not used with personal names. As a result they felt that a compound that used an inanimate object like a spear with bani was not reasonable as a byname. Since they felt that the descriptive bani by itself was a reasonable byname, they dropped the spjóts element to register the name.

Pippa Morosini. Change of name from Millicent Chandler. Her previous name of Millicent Chandler has been retained as an alternate persona name.

Vilhjálmr bani. Device. Gules, on a lozenge throughout argent a dragon passant in annulo head to base purpure. This was returned for conflict with the device of Cecilie die Ärtztin ("Gules, on a lozenge throughout argent, a bat-winged dolphin haurient contourny sable.")
